One successful model has been a **Private Investment, Public Facilitation** approach. This is one of the approaches recommended by the <u>Coalition for Local Internet Choice</u> (CLIC) and we've seen successful examples of this in North Carolina. This model typically includes:

- Making public real estate assets like towers, building rooftops, fiber, and conduit available.
- · Sharing GIS information on these assets.
- Streamlining the permitting and inspection processes, such as one-touch-make-ready on pole attachments, and a dig-once policy on buried fiber.
- Providing an economic development incentive to attract ISP investment.



Home » Consolidated Gains Eight More Public-Private Broadband Partnerships

Consolidated Communications will use public-private partnerships with eight New Hampshire communities to bring them fiber-to-the premises broadband networks. It is the latest in a string of Consolidated public-private broadband partnerships.

Consolidated has a growing strategy for these types of arrangements, recently announcing completion of one across three other New Hampshire towns and a new project in Brooklin, Maine.

The company said that the partnerships are a key component of its plans to expand rural broadband access. Subscriber fees help offset the cost of the operating agreement, so residents don't see resulting tax increases.






